Angry Inuk In her award-winning documentary, director Alethea Arnaquq-Baril joins a new tech-savvy generation of Inuit as they campaign to challenge longestablished perceptions of seal hunting.

Kayak to Klemtu When a prominent Kitasoo/Xai'Xais activist passes away, his 14-year-old niece embarks on a kayak journey to take his ashes home to Klemtu. It's a race against the clock as she tries to make it back in time to give a speech protesting a proposed pipeline that would cross Indigenous land.

Beyond Climate This film takes viewers beyond the headlines and into the heart of the issues. The film holistically connects the larger patterns of climate change with the human dimension, and what it looks like across British Columbia from the top of the mountains to the depths of the oceans.

An Evening of Short Films, provided courtesy of the *National Film Board* **of Canada** Select media from Indigenous filmmakers on the specific topic of caring for the Earth will be screened and discussed with local members of the community.
