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SOURCES & RESOURCES

Things to know to help you and your organization grow

Each month I will share some sources and resources selected to support your professional development and/or to address needs or issues your organization may be facing.

COVID-19 has impacted how we do business in the nonprofit sector, especially in how we work. Many leaders of volunteers continue to work remotely; this means that the people we serve and the volunteers who deliver programs are also engaging remotely. Here a few low-cost or free tools tech tools to work effectively online:

Online Chat: This is a powerful way to connect whether you are across town or just down the hall. Using online chat is a great tool for quick interactions. A few platforms to look into include: Microsoft Teams, Slack, and Google Chat. Set up 'channels' for your teams or specific projects. Be sure to set up some guidelines for usage to keep this a useful and management communication tool.

Creating Community: Setting up private online communities are low-cost (or free) ways to bring volunteers and staff together to build and support teams. Check out <u>Rallyhood</u>, <u>Facebook Groups</u>, <u>Gather</u> and <u>Circle</u>. Host a social, conference, or set up regular check-in meetings with remote volunteers. When selecting a tool, check to see how it might integrate with tools you are already using.

Managing Projects: Consider using an online tool such as <u>Asana</u>, <u>Google Sheets</u>, or <u>Trello</u> with your next special event committee to keep all aspects of a project in one place to track assigned tasks, due dates, and updates.
